TOWNSHIP OF CLAY CLAY TOWNSHIP BOARD MEETING JULY 22, 2015, 7:00 PM MANTRAP VALLEY CONSERVATION CLUB PARK RAPIDS, MN

<u>1. CALL TO ORDER</u>: The July 22nd, 2015, Meeting of the Clay Township Board was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Chair Andy Kietzman, and those present recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

<u>2. ROLL CALL:</u> Present: Supervisors Jeff Haukebo, Andy Kietzman and Norm Leistikow, Treasurer Del Holz, and Clerk Margie Vik. Absent: None. Others Present: None.

<u>3. APPROVAL OF AGENDA:</u> A motion was made by Kietzman, seconded by Leistikow, and unanimously carried to approve the agenda as presented.

4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

<u>A. Clay Township Regular Meeting Minutes-May 27, 2015:</u> A motion was made by Haukebo, seconded by Leistikow, and unanimously carried to approve the Clay Township Regular Meeting Minutes for May 27th, 2015, as presented.

5. NEW BUSINESS:

<u>A. Meetings:</u> Kietzman stated the Minnesota Association of Townships-District 11 meeting will be held in the Walker Community Center, on Wednesday, August 26th, 2015.

B. Minnesota Demographers Office: Vik stated the Minnesota Demographer's Office have reported the 2014 statistics as the population of Clay Township is 74, and the number is households is 35.

<u>C. Permits:</u> Haukebo reported he received a permit application from James May to replace a shed that burned down. He will be constructing a 64x32 pole building. There are no zoning issues with the permit request. A motion was made by Kietzman, seconded by Leistikow, and unanimously carried to approve the permit request for James May at 30962 County Road 4.

6. OLD BUSINESS:

<u>A. Road Issues:</u> Leistikow stated there are some branches on Jigsaw that could cause some issues with snow plowing in a couple of years. The county wants the ditches brushed down to nothing, although at times there is valuable brush that could be saved.

B. Shooting Range: Haukebo questioned if the Mantrap Valley Conservation Club was going to construct a building for the shooting range. Leistikow stated they have no money for it right now. Haukebo stated they have expanded it. Before the range was not a permitted use. An expanded use would not be permitted and there should be a public hearing prior to construction. Kietzman stated he would discuss it with Al Bruins.

<u>7. APPROVAL OF TREASURERS REPORT</u>: Holz stated he received \$120.00 for Emmaville beer licenses, and the June settlement check in the amount of \$30,959.15. The checking account balance is \$7,476.66, and the money market balance is \$149,578.82. The total funds are \$157,055.48. One outstanding check, for the total amount of \$110.82, has not cleared the bank yet. There is \$35,683.37 in reserves for the building fund. The total operating balance is \$121,261.29.

Holz stated the outstanding invoices for this month are Cumber Construction for \$16,488.75, and the Enterprise for \$86.10. Total payables are \$16,574.85.

A motion was made by Haukebo, seconded by Leistikow, and unanimously carried to approve the treasurer's report and to pay the outstanding invoices.

<u>8. ADJOURNMENT:</u> A motion was made by Kietzman, seconded by Leistikow, and unanimously carried to adjourn the meeting at 7:17 p.m.
